From the Spiritual Coordinator



This is part one of a sermon on compassion written by Pastor Dieter Dell'Antonio. What is compassion? The Greek word means a deep feeling of pity; sympathy with someone; a feeling coming from the most inner being of our existence; from the seat of our deepest emotions. It has its root in a word that means "guts". We say, I have a gut feeling about something. You know that feeling -- where your reaction to something sends your stomach churning. You might watch TV reports about earth quakes, volcano eruptions in Bali or Hawaii, or the recent floods in Japan or the drought in our own country and immediately decide to pray for those in need or send money to help people in need.

In Jesus' case, he had compassion because the people surrounding him were like sheep without a shepherd. In other words, they were lost and lacking guidance. But more so, they needed care, protection and nurture. For Jesus, **compassion is not just a feeling but a doing**. Jesus showed his followers how compassion is inherent to discipleship. Compassion is a requirement on our part, even more so, an impulse on our part. It hits us in the gut and sends us into motion for the sake of others. Think about it as sympathy with others, even suffering with others, having a passion to help. And so, this gut feeling should cause you to go outside of yourself -- to do something about it.

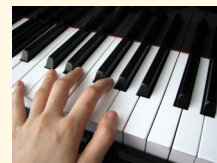


BOOK WEEK EVENTS AUGUST 18 - 24 2018, WEEK 5
