From the Spiritual Coordinator



A continuation from last week on the theme of compassion:

Jesus shows the compassion of God. To demonstrate compassion means to show mercy on a person. Deuteronomy 4:31 says: "For the Lord your God is a merciful God..." God showed mercy by having compassion on us and he sent his Son to die for us so that we can live. The "Hebrew Word Book" explains the word compassion - *that a merciful person is not simply possessed by pity but is actively compassionate*. One retired Thai navy seal, who volunteered in the recent Thai cave rescue, lost his life in this compassionate action.

The appropriate way for God to become active was to send his Son. In our reading the Son becomes active by being merciful to those in need. That is the depth of compassion Jesus feels for the unsaved and needy people of his time and such is the type of compassion Jesus wants us to have for people who have needs. He gave us the story from the "Good Samaritan" as an example for our behaviour -- an example of compassion plus action. How do we show mercy and compassion to other people and become active? There are many ways -- help the homeless with food or blankets -- give to all kinds of appeals such as the Drought Angels, Operation Christmas Child, the Christian Blind Mission, ALWS or give money & pray for people in need like refugees, asylum seekers or people affected by natural disasters.

Lord Jesus, I know that You secure justice for the poor and uphold the cause of the needy (Psalm 140:12). As a school, we want to be available to be used as an avenue of Your generosity and mercy. May we count it our privilege to share what You have given us, and to serve those in need in our community and around the world. Amen.

Lower Primary Social Emotional Learning

This week in Kimochi time, students in Transition to Year 2 met the Kimochi Characters!

Each character has a distinct personality with their own strengths and challenges. They are relatable, engaging and a playful way for kids to learn how to identify and express feelings.

The Kimochi characters are, Cloud, Bug, Cat, Huggtopus and Lovey Dove. **Cloud** is moody and unpredictable, he is learning to manage his big feelings. **Bug** is shy and thoughtful, he is learning to make friends and be brave. **Cat** is bossy and gets into fights but tries hard to mend her relationships and think of others. **Huggtopus** has six legs instead of eight, she is enthusiastic and loves to cuddle -- she is learning to respect personal space. Last, but not least, is **Lovey Dove**. Lovey Dove is calm, nurturing and the mother figure of the group, though she worries about her friends.

We will continue to develop the children's understanding of the Kimochi characters each week, exploring their feelings and coping strategies closely.
