This Week's Devotion

God blesses Endeavour in diversity

The story of Ruth is a peaceful story, even though it is set in the violent Biblical times of Judges. In those days Ruth would not have been viewed as an important person. She was poor, a widow and living in Israel, a foreign country. Ruth 2:5-7 Boaz asked the man in charge. "Who is that young woman?" The man answered "She is a foreigner from Moab who came back with Naomi".

Ruth was a Moabite woman. In Old Testament accounts (Genesis 19:30-38), the Moabites belonged to the same ethnic stock as the Israelites as their ancestral founder was Moab, a son of Lot, a nephew of the Israelite patriarch Abraham. The Moab* nation was 'frowned upon' by the Israelites because it originated from an unlawful relationship.

Ruth was not highly regarded by the Israelite community. However God loved her. He loves all people. God does not separate, based on ethnicity or social status. God's plans, typically involve elevating or using people who are considered underdogs, unimportant or outcasts. Ruth later marries Boaz, an Israelite and secures her place in Jesus ancestry, fulfilling God's eternal plan.

Once again we see God embracing people from diverse cultures and linguistic backgrounds. Today God asks us to work together as a diverse community endeavouring to include everyone in what we do.

*Today Moab kingdom, ancient Palestine is located east of the Dead Sea in what is now west-central Jordan
